## Drink Bottle Policy

### Effective Date

15 January 2007

The Riverstone Schofields Junior Soccer Football Club (the Club) warns all players and officials of the dangers of communicable diseases being transmitted by sharing of drink bottles. Test results show that sharing drink bottles occurs more frequently in sport and therefore places sports persons at a high risk of many diseases, particularly meningococcal.

- ⚽ Players must have their own drink bottle and team officials are to ensure that players use only their own bottle.
- ⚽ Players must not share their drink bottle with anyone.
- ⚽ Players must have their own drink bottle, clearly marked with their name, and bring same too each game and training session.
- ⚽ The Club strongly recommends that the practice of team officials keeping players drink bottles from match to match cease and that players are made entirely responsible for the care and upkeep of their own drink bottle.
- ⚽ Team Officials may only give a player a drink bottle that is clearly labelled signifying that it is the property of that player.
